## Atleast 20 dead as heavy rains trigger landslides in Darjeeling

■ Chief Minister Mamata Banerjee described the flood situation in North Bengal as "grave" and said she would visit the region on Monday to assess the damage.

sweeping away homes,
damaging roads and cutting off several remote
hamlets, officials said.
According to reports Darjeeling (WB)

According to reports compiled by the NDRF and the district administration, fatalities were reported from several locations - Sarsaly, Jasbirgaon, Mirik Basti, Dhar Gaon (Mechi), Nagrakata and Mirik Lake area. According to the NDRF statement at least 11 people have died in Mirik, the worst affected area in the landslide, and seven injured have been rescued from the area. In Darjeeling, seven people died and the rescue operations were underway with the help of police, local administration and disaster response teams.



"Seven deaths have been reported due to a major landslide in Dar-jeeling subdivision trig-gered by heavy rainfall since last night. The res-cue and relief work is on," Darjeeling Sub-Division-al Officer (SDO) Richard Lepcha said.

Chief Minister Mam-ata Banerjee announced compensation for the vic-tims without specifying the amount and the num-ber of deaths and said she would visit north Bengal on October 6 to assess the situation in the region where a large number of

Prime Minister Narendra Modi also expressed condolences over the deaths and said the situation in Darjeeling and surrounding areas is being closely monitored in ing closely monitored in the wake of heavy rains

#### US has to respect India's 'red lines': Jaishankar

New Delhi:

In y trade deal between India and the United States has to respect New Delhi's 'red lines' and efforts are underway to find a 'landing ground', External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar said on Sunday amid strain in ties between the two countries over Washington, DC's policy on tariff.

In an interactive session at an event, Jaishankar acknowledged having issues between India and the US and that many of them are linked to the inability to firm up the proposed trade deal.

#### No handshake again! India, Pakistan skip pleasantries

The tension between India and teams resurfaced once again – this time at the Women's World Cup 2025 in Colombo – as captains Harmanpreet Kaur and Fatima Sana pointedly skipped the customary handshake at the toss on Sunday. What seemed like a small gesture – or its absence – was in fact a continuation of India's quiet but firm no-handshake stance against Pakistan, mirroring the deepening off-field Colombo:

## 40 killed in landslides floods triggered by downpour in Nepal

A t least 40 people have been killed in different places of eastern Nepal till Sunday morning and five have gone missing due to landslides and floods triggered by downpour since last night.

As many as 37 people were killed in different places of Ilam district

"There has been continuous, heavy rain for 12 hours. Landslides have occurred at seven locations. I am keeping a close watch and hope to reach by around 3 pm on Monday," she said.

Thousands of tourists have been stranded across the region due to the landslides and road blockages. The CM assured them that the state government would make arrangements to bring

government would make arrangements to bring them back safely and appealed to tourists not to panic or rush to leave. "Many tourists are stranded. I request them not to hurry. Please stay where you are. Hotels must not overcharge them. Their safety is our responsibility, and the administration will ensure that," she said. Banerjee also announced that the families of those killed in the disaster would receive government compensation and employment for one of their members, though

This 32-93 km stretch,
part of Eastern Railmay's Sealdah division,
links Bangaon near the
Bangladesh border with
the Sealdah-Krishnanagar main line, providing a shorter and faster
route for both freight
and passenger movement between Nadia
and North 24 Parganas
districts.
Currently operating
as a single-line network,
the section connects
stations such as Cooper's Halt, Naba Raynagar Halt, Gangnapur,
Majhergram, Akaipur
Halt, Gopalnagar, and
Satberia. With growing
population and increasing demand for efficient
logistics, the doubling
project is expected to
ease congestion, reduce

The Greater Noida Authority is going to renovate as many as 20 theme parks of the city including City Park.
Along with the general parks, theme based special parks have also been developed in the Alpha, Beta. Gamma, Delta etc sectors of the city. Currently these parks are in poor shape due to lack of maintenance. Even regular cleaning is not being dome. In view of this, the authority has prepared an action plan for the renovation of the dilapidated theme parks.

In the first phase, 21 theme parks have been identified. According to the official concerned, the theme parks will be renovated and

To ensure this work is carried out efficiently, the assistance of specialized companies involved in the garden business is being sought. Work will commence after consulting the experts. Authority will shortlist agencies specialisaed in three categories: architecture, decoration, and landscaping. The 27 agencies that have come forward for this work will submit presentations soon. The renovation work is expected to begin in the next one to two months. #### Jaishankar flags rise of contactless wars, calls it a turning point in global conflict

At the 4th Kautilya Economic Conclave in New
Delhi, External Affairs
Minister Dr. S. Jaishankar offered a sharp
analysis of the changing
nature of global conflict,
warning that the world
has entered an "era of
contactless warfare." In
a thought-provoking ada thought-provoking ad-dress, he said that both dress, he said that both the nature of weapon; and the conduct of war have undergone a fundamental transformation, altering the very foundation of international

action of international security.
Citing examples from recent conflicts across the world—from the Azerbaijan-Armenia clashes and the ongoing Ukraine-Russia war to tensions between Israel and Iran—Jaishankar highlighted how technology has made it possible to wage wars without physical engagement. These "stand-off" or remote warfare methods, he said, can now achieve decisive outcomes with

he said, can now achieve decisive outcomes with-out troops ever coming into direct contact.

"This is a time when the nature of weapon-ry and the nature of war has fundamentally changed," Jaishankar remarked, pointing out that precision and reach have become as critical as manpower and teras manpower and ter-ritory once were. The minister noted that this

shift is redefining strate-gic thinking, as nations increasingly rely on drones, cyber tools, and long-range systems to project power.

Jaishankar also spoke about the parallel trans-formation taking place in the global political and economic order. He observed that resistance to globalization is gain-ing ground in many re-gions, leading to shifts in alliances and trade patterns. This backlash, he suggested, is forcing countries to recalibrate not just their diplomatic positions but also their strategic priorities.

he teacher transfer and posting process in Haryana has been a source of controversy and discontent for years. Teachers and employees feel that the policies, while clear in their pronouncements, are actually complex and complicated. This issue is not just about the interests of employees, but also about the transparency, fairness, and quality of the entire education system.

Even when a position is approved by the Finance Department, the transfer process is often unnecessarily delayed. This is due to budgetary constraints, documentation, or the unnecessary need for repeated approvals at the administrative level. This delay not only slows down the process but also hinders the proper and timely implementation of the policy. Employees remain in uncertainty for months, lowering their morale and impacting the efficiency of the education system.

In married cases, where teachers seek postings with their spouses, the process of re-examination and approval is initiated despite the already pending cases. This causes unnecessary inconvenience to employees and highlights the complexity of the policy. It also indicates that the administration sometimes deliberately prolongs the process.

There are many factors involved in preventing transfers. Long-term employees are reluctant to leave their positions. Unions and organizations intervene to protect the interests of their members. Furthermore, the administration prefers to retain experienced employees in sensitive positions for longer periods. Due to all these factors, the transfer process is often not balanced and fair.

This contradiction creates confusion and dissatisfaction among employees. This gap between announcements and actual implementation sends the message that mere statements do not translate into policy implementation.

Administrative resistance, traditional work cultures, and the priorities of local officials all contribute to this. Unless all parties ensure transparency and time ly action, the online system cannot be effective.

Despite adequate positions being available at the time of new appointments, transfers are delayed. This raises the question of whether employees are being deliberately sent away or whether some are being given a privilege. The possibility of no transfers due
